

LAW COLLEGE DEHRADUN ORGANISES AN EMOTIONAL ALUMNI MEET – 2022 5th March 2022




National Webinar on “Careers in Intellectual Property Right with Special Reference to Patent Filing”- 10th March 2022

Established in 1932 on the 206-acre campus, the Indian Military Academy at Dehradun was a learning curve for the students of law who had visited the Chetwode Building, named after Sir Philip C. Chetwode, Field Marshal of the erstwhile British Indian Army, housing an immaculate museum exhibiting the heritage of the Academy and the Indian Army, magnificent portraits of the Chiefs of the Indian Army and former Commandants of the Academy, various artifacts, arms, weaponry and military hardware captured the Indian soldiers during various conflicts throughout the history of Independent India.

Subsequently, the visitors were greeted by the Commandant of the Indian Military Academy who interacted with the students and encouraged them to explore the avenues of career service in the Armed Forces. Thereafter, Major Bharat Kanojia, IV Gorkha Rifles, coordinated with the visitors and guided them through the halls of the Academic Block which encompasses the Central



Library of the Academy which boasts a collection of over sixty thousand books spanning all the way from the seventeenth century.

An ecological system (or ecosystem) is a community of biotic and abiotic factors interacting with each other. For instance, living organisms share the benefits of a particular space and environment. They are the foundation of the 'Biosphere' and maintain the natural balance of the earth. Each organism in an ecosystem has its role and purpose. On the other hand, ecosystem degradation is a global environmental problem that decreases the capacity of species to survive. Around 60% of the Earth's ecosystem has been degraded in the past 60 years. This continuous practice makes it hard for our natural ecosystem to cope and adjust soon, despite our best efforts it will be too late for them to recover.

The webinar was a great learning experience for the participants, which helped them in understanding the Significance of quality of life on Earth. The session was ended by Mr. Shaurya Negi, Executive member of the society after vote of thanks.


Hon’ble Chancellor of the University gave the winners a total of Rs. 65,000 as cash prizes along with rolling trophies and mementos.

He weaved the ideology of justice from the past to the contemporary times by discussing the evolution of the justice deliverance from the ancient Indian perspective of Dharmas, the historical jurisprudence of the western philosophers, the

positivists and the analytical domain over a period of time to the modern-day jurisprudential concepts that facilitate the deliverance of justice.

On the 18th of May, Dr. Dayanand Murthy from Damodaram Sanjeevalah National Law University spoke on the insolvency and bankruptcy laws, their significance in the contemporary times and the role of the modern day IBC in deciding the dispute and finding a solution to the challenges of corporate governance with specific reference to bankruptcy and insolvency and its impact on the economic status of the nation on a global platform, through various decided and landmark judgments in the domain of economic laws.

Professor Muralidharan took centre stage on the 19th with his extempore and energetic talk on Indian and International arbitration sharing his live experience in arbitration and mediation. He explained at length on the necessity of teachers of law to understand the idea of arbitration and mediation and explain with examples, both hestorative and decided judgments on the significance of arbitration in the contemporary legal domain, by citing the cases of Emmron, Cairn Energy and the Reliance Future- Amazen arbitration decisions.

On the 20th we had Professor Ashok Kumar Makkar from CDLU, Siruar deliver a candid, realistic and lucid presentation on plagiarism and copyright infringement, the relevance of the idea of plagiarism to contemporary writers especially in the academic field. He dealt at length on the decided cases of copyright infringement, importance of plagiarism and the effect of plagiarism especially in the context of the UGC regulation of 2018 which is a guideline to curb plagiarism, copying and pillage of work of other authors and presenting as one's own.

21st of May was graced by the august presence of Dr. Arvind Singh political scientist and noted author from Moradabad who spoke on the

nuances of book writing This was an interactive session with the speaker discussing the aspects dot lead to the creation of a book, be it fiction or nonfiction, academic or Informative in nature. The central idea as per the speaker is the introduction, plot, the essence and the catchy title of the book which required drafting and redrafting through stages of reviews and amendments.

Prof. Ahmed Naseem, Dean Gorakhpur spoke on the concept of good governance, the right to information and relevance of these ideologies to human rights on the 22 of May and dealt at large and in-depth on the ideology of good governance and its implementation while focusing on the challenges of lack of information and enforceability of the principles of good governance. ARMED CONFLICT-HUMAN RIGHTS IN PERSPECTIVE OF CHILDREN

Legal protection of children during armed conflict is basically dealt in two branches of international law, namely, the “**International Humanitarian Law**” that seeks to regulate the methods and means of warfare and the treatment of people in times of war, (e.g. prisoners of war, injured soldiers) Participating in the hostilities and the “**International Human Rights Law**”.

Children’s Rights have been explicitly recognized by the international community with the adoption of the “**Convention On The Right Of The Child (CRC), 1989**” contains a comprehensive set of economic, social and cultural rights as well as civil and political rights, which are considered to be indivisible and interdependent along with the Optional Protocol to “**The Convention On The Rights Of The Child On The Involvement Of Children In Armed Conflict, 2000**” to address the widespread recruitment and use of children by

armed forces around the world, the **Rome Statue Of the International Criminal Court 1998** which lists the recruitment of under 15 years to participate directly in international conflicts, and in conflicts not of an international character, as a war crime; and **ILO Convention 182 , 1999** deal with the prohibition and immediate action for the elimination of the worst forms of child.
