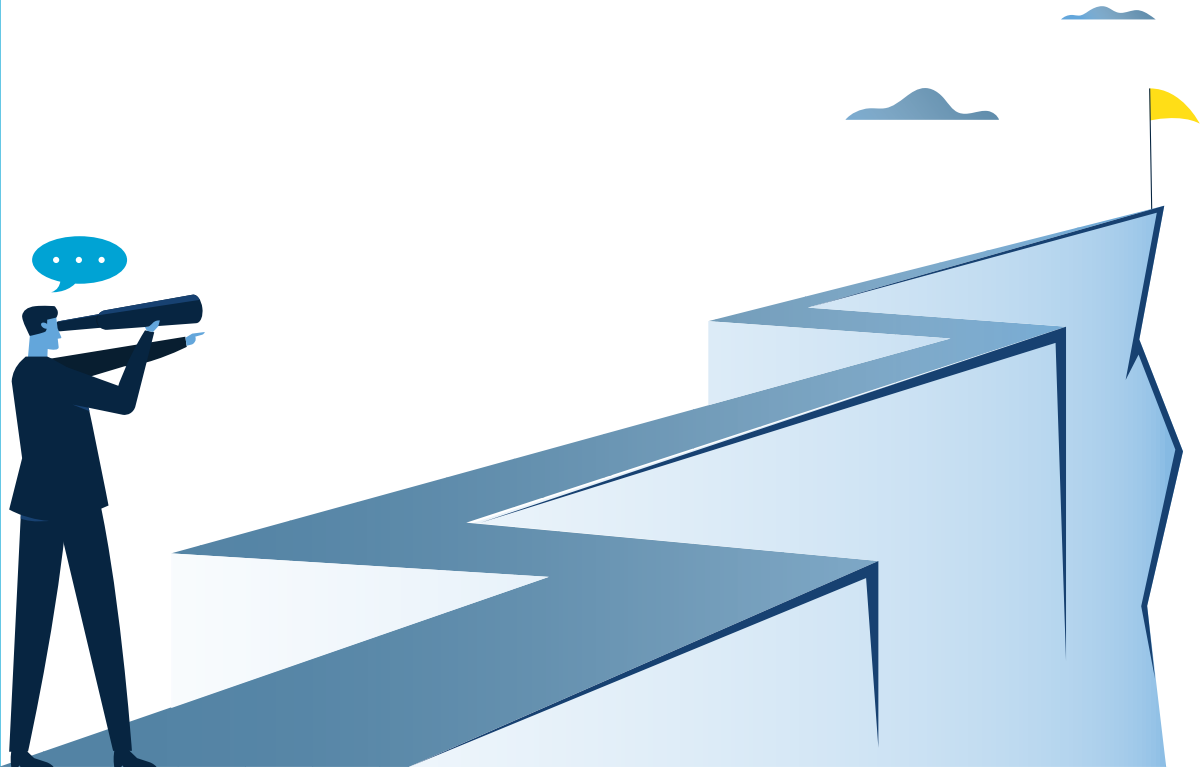

The Uttaranchal University Library System is a robust network designed to provide specialized academic support. It includes the following libraries, collectively advancing the university's teaching, research, and extension programs:

1. **Central Library:** The primary academic hub supporting all disciplines with extensive digital and print resources.
2. **LCD Library:** Specifically tailored for legal scholars, the LCD Library is one of the most comprehensive legal repositories in the region.
3. **UIM Library:** Catering to the needs of business, commerce, and management students.
4. **UIT Library:** Providing technical resources, standards, and journals for the applied sciences.
5. **UCN Library:** The UCN Library at Uttaranchal University is the specialized departmental library for the Uttaranchal College of Nursing. While it functions as a dedicated hub for nursing students.
6. **Health Science Library:** The Health Sciences Library at Uttaranchal University is a specialized division of the Central Library. It is specifically designed to support the Uttaranchal College of Health Sciences (UCHS).
7. **UIPS Library:** It is specifically designed to support students of D. Pharma, B. Pharm, M. Pharm, and Doctoral programs with highly specialized pharmaceutical literature and digital resources.

Library Collection

The Central Library is designed to give access to high-quality instructional and research materials to the users of the Uttaranchal university. UU intends to establish a model library that will be the principal academic facilitator of the university. The library will play a vital role in the development and diffusion of knowledge in the academic institution. The central library contains a comprehensive variety of materials in the disciplines of Law, Management, Agriculture, Pharmacy, Liberal Arts, Mass Communication, Sciences, Nursing, Heal Sciences, Ayurveda, Electronics and Communication Engineering, Computer Science and Engineering, Computer Applications, Mechanical Engineering, Physics, Mathematics, and English Language & Literature and many more. The materials include reference books, textbooks, CDs/DVDs, etc. The library offers technical services such as classification, cataloging, and documentation to the users of our university with the purpose of providing research and instructional assistance. Major Library Networks & Consortia

- **DELNET (Developing Library Network):** Provides access to a massive union catalogue of over 30 million records. Our members can avail themselves of Inter-Library Loan (ILL) and Document Delivery Services (DDS) to borrow books or receive journal articles from thousands of member libraries across India and abroad.
- **INFLIBNET (Information and Library Network Centre):** An essential gateway to national research. Through INFLIBNET, the library participates in:
 - **e-ShodhSindhu:** Access to high-quality peer-reviewed journals and bibliographic databases.
 - **Shodhganga:** The national digital repository for Indian electronic theses and dissertations.
 - **NDLI (National Digital Library of India):** A virtual repository of learning resources sponsored by the Ministry of Education. It provides a single-window search for millions of academic items across various languages and disciplines.

New Arrival

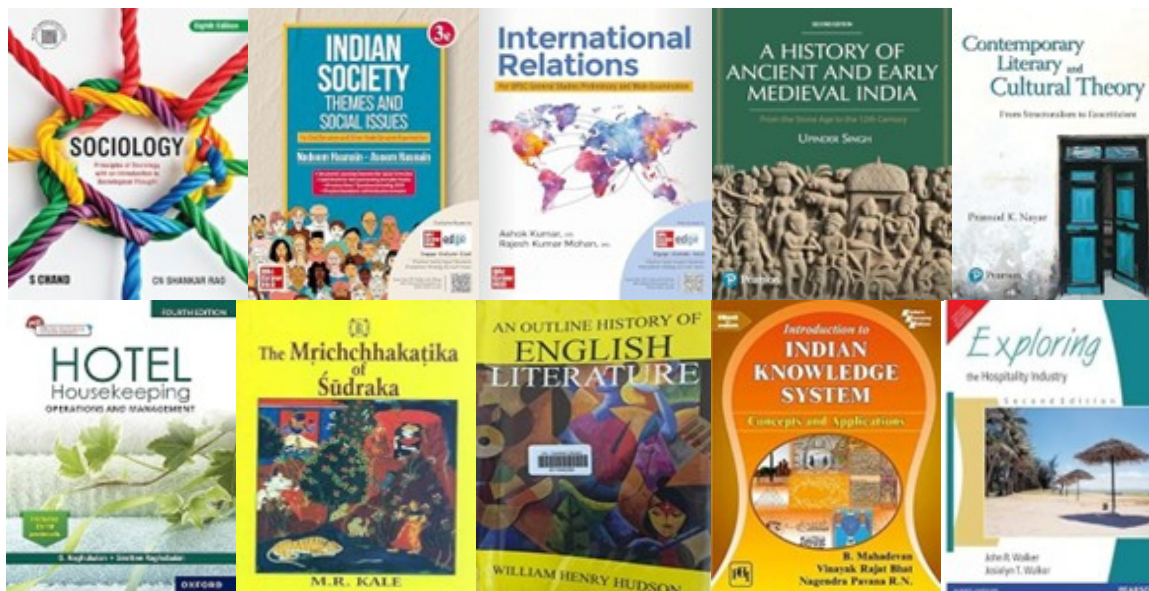

About the Central Library

The Central Library, Uttarakhand University, serves as a core academic support system for teaching, learning, and research activities. It provides a safe, technology-enabled, and user-friendly environment designed to meet the information needs of students, faculty members, and researchers across disciplines. The Library is fully automated through the LIBCYB Integrated Library Management System (ERP) to ensure efficient and transparent service delivery.

Library Automation

In this age of Information and Communication Technology, computers are being used for day-to-day housekeeping activity of the library which saves the time of the end-users and library professionals also and at the same time avoid duplication of work and make the library service smooth and effective. The influence of ICT has drastically changed the library scenario in terms of collection, organization, and services. Simultaneously, users' demands, attitudes, and information seeking behavior have dynamically changed. They need relevant, accurate, authentic information easily, and quickly within a single place at their hand.

For quick delivery of library services and information, the Library has been fully automated with LIBCYB ERP software and started online services including renewal, resource access, etc. At the present library, users can enjoy the library facilities online from anywhere.

Users can search for their desired document/article through Library OPAC which can be accessed from anywhere, anytime, and also a list of open access resources is provided through the OPAC which helps them to search and access it whenever required.

Digital Library and E-resources

The Digital Library provides 24×7 access to e-books, e-journals, databases, theses, question papers, and institutional scholarly content. Users can access resources through ERP-integrated systems and the Knimbus mobile application. The Library subscribes to multidisciplinary databases including IEEE, JSTOR, Sage, LexisNexis, Manupatra, HeinOnline, EBSCO, and EPWRF to support research and academic programmes.

Access: Offers 24/7 access to digital and online learning resources.

Management: Fully automated with the LIBCYB-Integrated Library Management System (ERP).

Consortia: Has memberships in digital consortia like the National Digital Library of India, DELNET, Shodh Ganga and e-Shodh Sindhu, Shodh Shuddhi.

Mobile access: Users can access e-resources on their mobile phones by downloading the Knimbus m-Library App from the Google Play Store and Apple App Store.

Research Portfolio

The Central Library provides structured research support services including plagiarism detection, literature search assistance, bibliographic support, reference management guidance, publication support, database training, and research awareness workshops. These services support researchers across all stages of the research lifecycle.

OPAC

Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is an online system that allows users to search a library's collection of resources through the University ERP system. It's essentially the digital version of a library catalogue. Users can search for items by title, author, subject, or other keywords, similar to using a search engine.




- A request mail has to send at lrc@uumail.in form your official mail. I.D

- Don't oblige non-bonafide research scholars, students, faculty and staff of the university





International Conference

The 3rd International Conference of Library & Technology on “Artificial Intelligence and Humanities in Library and Education 4.0” (AIHLE-2025) was held on 7-8 November 2025, jointly organized by the Central Library, SLA, and UIT, Uttarakhand University:

The event began with the traditional lamp lighting and the University Kulgeet, setting the tone for two days of deliberations. The inaugural ceremony was attended by President Shri Jitender Joshi, VP Ms. Ankita Joshi, VC Prof. Dharam Buddhi, Chief Guest Padma Shri Prof. Harmohinder Singh Bedi (Chancellor, H.P. Central University), Prof. K.P. Singh (Director, Gandhi Bhawan, University of Delhi), Dr. Renecynth B. Jaurigue (Philippines), PVC Prof. Rajesh Bahuguna, and several eminent academicians and delegates. The session was moderated by Ms. Malika Payal.

In his welcome address, Conference Convener and University Librarian Dr. Ramveer Tanwar outlined the conference's vision of integrating education and technology through AI. Dr. Jaurigue highlighted AI's growing role in information science; Prof. D. Buddhi emphasized the potential of Education 4.0; and VP Ms. Ankita Joshi accentuated that technology finds true purpose when applied for societal benefit.

Keynote Speaker Prof. K.P. Singh discussed the integration of libraries with emerging technologies, while Padma Shri Prof. Bedi reflected on the evolution of libraries in the digital era. The session concluded with a vote of thanks by Prof. (Dr.) Rita Rautela, followed by the National Song marking its 150th anniversary.

Two major panel discussions- “Ethical and Responsible AI for Sustainable Development” and “AI for Environmental Sustainability”- were held alongside paper presentations. Day 2 continued with presentations and a panel on “AI for Social Equity and Inclusion.”

At the Valedictory Ceremony, moderated by Ms. Ritu Baluni, Guest of Honour Dr. Nabi Hasan (Librarian, IIT Delhi) addressed the gathering. Prof. Rajiv Kumar Gill presented the Conference Report, noting participation from 400+ delegates across 20 States and multiple countries, with 55 papers published and 50 submitted to Springer nature Altantis Press platforms.

The conference concluded with the National Anthem, marking a dignified finale.

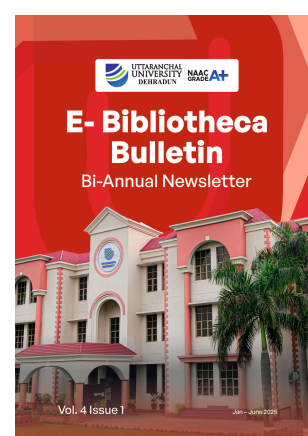


National Librarian's Day

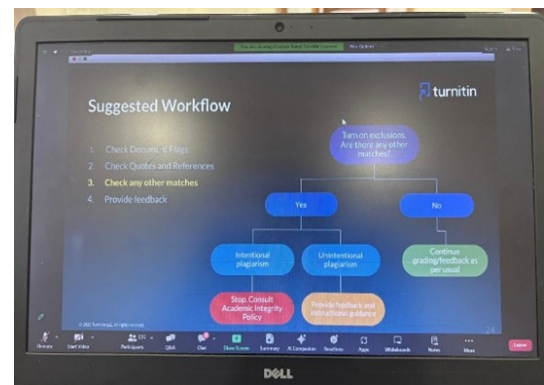
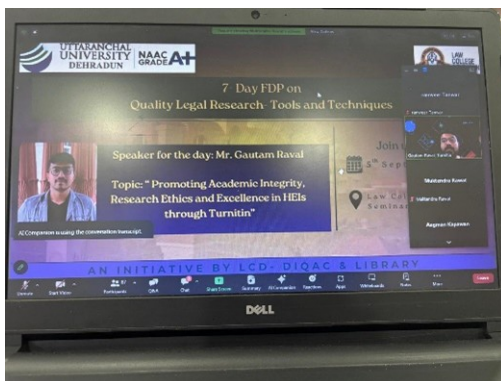


Training Programme

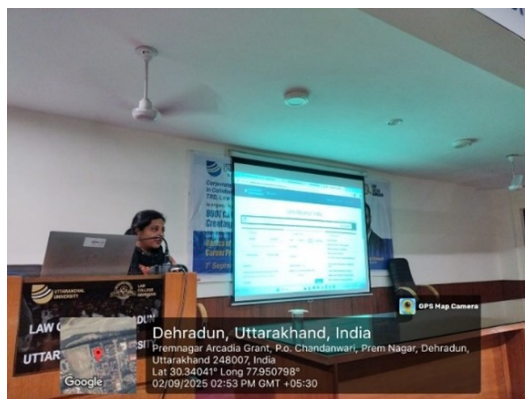


3. LexisNexis Legal Research Training

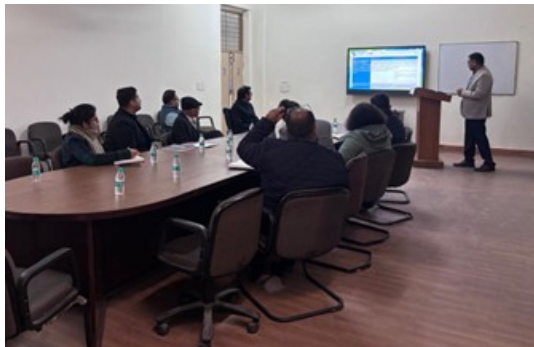

- 150 General/ Fiction and non-fiction and motivational books added in the Central Library.

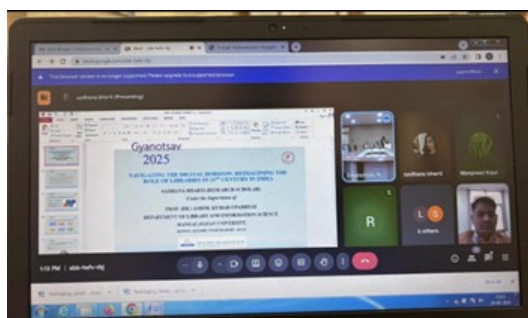
Internship Programme
