Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> · The institution is committed to use the best available teaching techniques and resources to provide a conducive learning environment for its students. Towards academic excellence the University implements project-based and experiential learning to impart the skills required in real life with the gist of critical thinking and collaborative learning. · The number of lecturers needed for each subject is divided by faculty members for each programme. The programme coordinator creates a timetable based on the academic calendar (as published by the University) in order to provide the required number of sessions for each subject. Time table and student attendance record is monitored by the University through centralized ERP management system. · The students are given an opportunity to become familiar with the subject before the programme starts by giving a brief overview of the main syllabus topics. Prior to the start of the course, the students are asked a few basic questions about the subject to assess their prior understanding. If it appears that the students in the classroom lack a fundamental understanding of the subject, the teacher first discusses the fundamentals with them before moving on to the core topic in depth. · The identified slow learners based on the mix of experience and periodic assessments are permitted to discuss their issues with teachers after class. The faculty members give some students more time if they are still unable to keep up with the pace of the class. The slow learners receive extra lecture notes from the faculty members as well. · The identified advanced learners are encouraged to participate at various levels and compete in events including quizzes, debates, workshops, and group discussions etc. · The interactive classroom practices by the faculty members (Including the use of the Smart TV with internet, projectors, power point presentations, and smart classrooms) aid the students in having a better understanding of the subjects. The ICT-enabled teaching-learning, benefits both the slow and the advanced learners. · The faculty members are well adapted to use a variety of cutting-edge teaching methodologies. They are continuously encouraged to adopt flipped classroom concepts with gamification tools along with modern audio-visual aids like Smart TVs, Projectors and the internet to promote e-learning. The learning of students has been greatly impacted by seminars and expert talks on personality development by outside professionals and industry experts. · Each lecture concludes with an option for each student to interact with the instructor one-on-one to clear any remaining doubts about the topic(s) covered in class. Faculty members have access to e-resources in their particular department that allows them to use the internet and visit the E-library to consult books and periodicals. The faculty members are encouraged to plan academic seminars, workshop and hackathons for the students to foster both cooperative and independent learning.
